

## PRINCETON CICLOVIA FAQ

Q: What is a ciclovía?

A: Ciclovía is a Spanish term that means "cycleway", either a permanent [bike path](#) or the closing of certain streets to [automobiles](#) for cyclists and pedestrians, a practice sometimes called "Open Streets".

Q: What can I do at the Princeton Ciclovía?

A: Participants can walk, push baby strollers, skate, run, bike, use wheelchairs and walkers, rollerblade, or dance. Leashed dogs are welcome to walk or run, too. D&R Canal Watch will lead two scheduled canal walks. View the schedule for times and other activities.

Q: Where does the Princeton Ciclovía start and end?

A: There is no official start or finish. Quaker Road will be closed at the intersection with Mercer Road, and at the intersection with Nassau Park Blvd. Participants can access the road from either end, or from the D&R Canal towpath.

Q: How do I get there?

A: Participants are encouraged to walk, run or ride to Quaker Road if they live close by. An easy paced ride will be led from Princeton Shopping Center at 12:15. Cyclists can also park and ride the tow path from any D&R Canal parking area. If riding or walking from the Institute Woods, take the Trolley Track Trail or the Pipeline Trail to Princeton Friends Meeting. If arriving via Mercer Road, there is an access path from the Princeton Battlefield parking area that leads to Friends Meeting.

Q: Where can I park if I drive there?

A: Parking is available on Mercer Road, adjacent to the Princeton Battlefield; in the parking lot at Princeton Friends; at Nassau Park in the Babies R Us lot.

Q: Who is sponsoring the Princeton Ciclovía?

A: The Princeton Pedestrian and Bicycle Advisory Committee has organized this event with the support of Princeton, the Princeton Police Department, West Windsor Bicycle and Pedestrian Alliance, East Coast Greenway, Greater Mercer TMA, Historical Society of Princeton, Princeton Friends Meeting, Princeton Friends School, Princeton Battlefield Society, Boys and Girls Club of Trenton and Mercer County Bike Exchange, Princeton Freewheelers, D&R Canal Watch, and Sustainable Princeton.
