**PRINCETON COUNCIL MEETING  
August 26, 2013**

A meeting of the Mayor and Council was held on this date at 7:00 p.m. in the Main Meeting Room in the municipal complex, 400 Witherspoon Street, Princeton, NJ 08540.

**NOTICE OF MEETING**

The Clerk read the following statement.

The following is an accurate statement concerning the providing of notice of this meeting and said statement shall be entered in the minutes of this meeting. Notice of this meeting as required by Sections 4a, 3d, 13 and 14 of the Open Public Meetings Act has been provided to the public in the form of the 2013 Schedule of Regular Meetings. On January 2, 2014 at 6:45 p.m., said schedule was posted on the official bulletin board in the Municipal Building, transmitted to the Princeton Packet, the Trenton Times, the Trentonian, the Town Topics, and filed with the Municipal Clerk.

**ROLL CALL**

The Municipal Clerk then called the roll.

Present: Mesdames Butler, Howard and Messers Liverman, Simon and Mayor Lempert.

Absent: Mr. Miller.

Also Present: Mr. Bruschi, Ms. Monzo, Mr. Kiser, Ms. Webb and Mr. Schmierer.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

The audience participated in the Pledge of Allegiance.

**COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC**

Kip Cherry, 24 Dempsey Avenue discussed with Council the success of the petition drive and the support to save the Valley Road School. Ms. Cherry said that there is an out of state investor interested in the Valley Road School project.

Bruce Afron, Esq. said that he had met with Mr. Schmierer to discuss the timing issue of the petition. He said that while the timing of the petition may not compel the issue to be on the ballot, he said that he disagreed about the question of the municipality to negotiate with the school board regarding the property.

Richard Woodbridge, 681 Prospect Avenue said that Larry Sprague specializes in taking public buildings to renovate and rehab at zero cost.

## **PRESENTATION**

### **Parks and Recreation Fund, Peter O'Neill**

Mr. O'Neill discussed with Council the Parks and Recreation Fund. He said that they are still in the process of collecting funds for the Community Park Pool project. He said that the initial cost was \$6.1 million for the pool project and that the fund made an agreement to raise \$1 million toward it.

Ms. Butler said that the group did a yeoman's job during the fund drive and we thank you. Mr. O'Neill said that the original agreement was done in July 2012 for a concrete pool then amended to the pool that we have now. Ms. Butler asked if we could find a way to turn over what was raised to date and invested. Mayor Lempert said that it could be done by putting an amended agreement on the next meeting agenda.

Mr. Simon asked if we are talking about covering the \$1 million in debt service or the debt overall. Ms. Monzo said that it would be the \$1 million in debt service over 20 years.

## **REPORTS**

### **2013 Budget Status Report**

Ms. Webb discussed with Council the 2013 Budget status report. She said that this was something that was done routinely in the Borough. Ms. Bruschi said that it gave Council a review of how we are performing. Mr. Simon asked if we more or less project where we will be at the end of the year. Ms. Webb said that we could do that. Ms. Butler said that previously Borough legal fees had ran over and wondered if we are currently on track with that. Ms. Webb said that we are at about 44%.

Mr. Simon asked if we had a budget for Construction, Court and the Parking Utility and whether we could have that for the next meeting in September. Ms. Webb said that could be done.

### **Transco Pipeline Status Report**

Mr. Kiser said that there have been numerous meetings with Transco, the latest being August 6, 2013. He said that he walked the entire length of the line and looked at the trees and noted that Transco would be updating their plan.

Mr. Simon asked what the timeline was going forward. Mr. Schmierer said that decisions need to be made regarding how to proceed by mid-September. Mr. Butler asked if Council could get a written report on the project for review, and Mr. Schmierer said yes. Mayor Lempert said that discussion of the report would be on the agenda for the second meeting in September.

## **ORDINANCE PUBLIC HEARINGS**

### **Bond Ordinance, Sidewalks**

Mayor Lempert read by title an ordinance entitled BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AS A LOCAL IMPROVEMENT THE REPAIR AND RECONSTRUCTION OF SIDEWALKS ALONG MOORE STREET, PARK PLACE, VAN DEVENTER AVENUE AND WILLOW STREET WITHIN PRINCETON, APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$35,100.00 THEREFOR, PROVIDING FOR THE FINANCING OF SAID APPROPRIATION BY THE MAKING OF A DOWN PAYMENT AND THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS AND NOTES OF SAID PRINCETON AND FURTHER PROVIDING FOR THE SPECIAL ASSESSMENT OF FIFTY (50%) PERCENT OF THE COST THEREOF.

Mayor Lempert opened the public hearing.

There being no public comment, the public hearing was closed.

Ms. Butler offered a motion to approve the proposed ordinance on second reading. The motion was seconded by Ms. Howard and carried unanimously by those present.

### **Bond Ordinance, Sewer Laterals**

Mayor Lempert read by title an ordinance entitled BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AS A LOCAL IMPROVEMENT SEWER LATERAL REPAIRS BY THE PRINCETON SEWER OPERATING COMMITTEE OF DEFECTIVE SEWER LATERALS INVOLVING PROPERTIES ALONG MOORE STREET, PARK PLACE, VANDEVENTER AVENUE AND WILLOW STREET WITHIN PRINCETON, APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$236,400.00 THEREFOR, PROVIDING FOR THE FINANCING OF SAID APPROPRIATION BY THE MAKING OF A DOWN PAYMENT AND THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS AND NOTES OF SAID PRINCETON AND FURTHER

PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT OF ONE HUNDRED (100%) PERCENT OF THE COST THEREOF UPON THE BENEFITTED PROPERTY OWNERS

Mayor Lempert opened the public hearing.

There being no public comment, the public hearing was closed.

Ms. Butler offered a motion to approve the proposed ordinance on second reading. The motion was seconded by Ms. Crumiller and carried unanimously by those present.

**Princeton Police Department, Appropriate Authority**

Mayor Lempert read by title an ordinance entitled AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE PRINCETON POLICE DEPARTMENT AND AMENDING THE “CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PRINCETON, NEW JERSEY 1068” AND THE “CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF PRINCETON, NEW JERSEY, 1974”.

Mayor Lempert opened the public hearing.

There being no public comment, the public hearing was closed.

Ms. Howard said that it is best practices and common sense for the administrator to be the appropriate authority, but that she would be open to the Public Safety Committee acting as the appropriate authority. Ms. Crumiller said that she would like to have the ultimate say and that she did not understand the best practices argument.

Ms. Butler said that having Council as the appropriate authority is consistent with our form of government. She said that Mr. Bruschi has six weeks of vacation and that Ms. Monzo has not been on the job long enough for these decisions.

Mr. Liverman said that as a member of the Public Safety Committee he was comfortable with the administrator as the appropriate authority.

Mr. Simon said that he wanted clarity and a written guideline on what a substantive change is so as not to be caught of guard.

Ms. Crumiller said that she did not feel like Council has had an inordinate number of discussions on this ordinance. Ms. Howard said suggested that a conference call be set up with the New Jersey League of Municipalities. Mr. Simon said that the overall impact on Council is that they could not agree.

Ms. Butler offered a motion to amend and introduce the proposed ordinance naming Council as appropriate authority on first reading. Ms. Crumiller seconded the motion, which was carried by three affirmative votes. Ms. Howard and Mr. Liverman voted in the negative and Mr. Miller was absent. The public hearing for the amended ordinance was set for September 9, 2013.
