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**I. STATEMENT CONCERNING NOTICE OF MEETING**

The following is an accurate statement concerning the providing of notice of this meeting and said statement shall be entered in the minutes of this meeting. Notice of this meeting as required by Sections 4a, 3d, 13 and 14 of the Open Public Meetings Act has been provided to the public in the form of a written notice. On July 11, 2016 at 1:10 p.m., said notice was posted on the official bulletin board in the Municipal Building, transmitted to the Princeton Packet, the Trenton Times, the Town Topics and filed with the Municipal Clerk.

**II. ROLL CALL**

The Municipal Clerk then called the roll.

**III. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

The audience participated in the pledge of allegiance.

**IV. ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Ms. Butler said that there would be a Blue Curtain Concert on July 16, 2016, beginning at 7:00 p.m. at Community Park North.

**V. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA**

Paul Budline, 39 Rollingmead, asked if Princeton is a "Sanctuary City", as he believes that crimes are being committed by illegal immigrants. Ms. Howard said that Princeton is not a "Sanctuary City", but a "Welcoming Community". Princeton follows the New Jersey Attorney General's directive when someone is reported to Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). Ms. Howard stated that immigrants can also be victims of crimes and deserve our protection. Mr. Budline responded that he only hoped that welcoming does not lead to criminality as immigrants are living here illegally. Ms. Howard said that it was important to trust our police department and that Princeton is a safe and livable community.

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**VII. REPORTS**

1. April and May 2016 Police Reports

Lt. Toole reviewed with Council the April and May 2016 Police Reports.

Ms. Howard noted that this has been a tough week for the police department in light of recent national events, and asked how the officers were doing. Lt. Toole said that Chief Sutter sent out a memorandum to the department in an effort to build their confidence and asked them to be extra careful. He said that they are doubling up patrols with two officers in each patrol car. The department is also reviewing their civil service procedures.

Ms. Crumiller said that our police force is very pro-active in protecting people’s civil liberties.

Mr. Liverman said that if there is anything the police department needs, to please let Council know. He also recounted a recent situation whereby a minister was pulled over by one of our patrols. The minister said that it was a “positive” experience.

Ms. Butler noted that on page 6 of the May police report minorities appeared to have been arrested at a higher rate and she felt that this was worth further discussion.

**Council Reports**

Ms. Crumiller said that the Traffic Safety Committee was discussing speed humps on John Street. Ms. Butler said that there were major reasons not to do this, such as potential damage to ambulances that may go over the speed humps. Ms. Stockton said that the police department has done a speed study on John Street and reported that a majority of vehicles are not breaking the speed limit.

Mr. Miller congratulated the Friends of Princeton Open Space (FPOS) on the condition of the trails and markings at Mountain Lakes.

Ms. Butler announced that another Mercer County “Mercer At Play” grant is available and reminded everyone that renovations of Community Park South will be the next big capital project.

Mayor Lempert said the Princeton Police Department has stopped using Nixel to notify people of Engineering road closings. She also reported that the second floor of the Princeton Library is currently closed and under construction.

### Staff Reports

Ms. Stockton reported that under Executive Order 210, the Carter Road and Valley Road projects are currently shut down. She said that non State funded projects are moving along as planned.

Ms. Stockton stated that Princeton was successful in receiving a \$65,000.00 grant to use for a parking study.

## VIII. WORK SESSION

1. Main Meeting Room Audio/Visual Upgrade, Robert McQueen, Chief Information Officer

Robert McQueen, Chief Information Officer, discussed with Council the proposal for the Main Meeting Room Audio/Visual Upgrade. He discussed current issues, survey results and asked Council what direction they wanted to move in.

(Power point presentation appended to this set of minutes)

Mayor Lempert asked for monitors that worked but are cost efficient. She said that she was concerned about the overall price of the project.

Ms. Howard asked what could be done to improve the overall resident experience. She said that she felt that it was inappropriate to spend more money than we need to.

Ms. Crumiller said that almost everything on the list is for the public.

Mr. Simon asked if the project would be under state contract. Mr. McQueen said that it would.

Mr. Dashield said that this project replaces what we currently have in the main meeting room, but there are other alternatives.

Ms. Butler said that she agreed as she has been frustrated with the current set up. She asked if Mr. McQueen had also spoken to the Planning Board. He said that he had not.

Ms. Butler suggested two public microphones and a mechanism to call into a meeting.

Mr. Simon suggested that Mr. McQueen get advice from Peter Thompson, Princeton School District. Mr. McQueen said that he has spoken to him.

Mr. McQueen said that he will go through the list of items for the proposed project, review them with the consultant and bring the proposal back to Council for further discussion.

**IX. ORDINANCE PUBLIC HEARING**

1. 2016-33 An Ordinance By Princeton Concerning Flood Damage Prevention, Amending Chapter 14a Of The "Code Of The Borough Of Princeton, New Jersey, 1974", And Repealing Chapter 9a Of The "Code Of The Township Of Princeton, New Jersey, 1968"

Mayor Lempert opened the public hearing.

Mr. Simon referred to an email from Grace Sinden, Ridgeview Circle asking for amendments to the proposed ordinance as follows:

- On page 3, under "Development" please add removal of trees to the other factors listed.
- On page 13 in Sec. 14A-5.1-4 please note my two suggested additions inserted IN CAPS:  
Sec. 14A-5.1-4. Subdivision proposals a) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall be consistent with the need to minimize flood damage, INCLUDING THE BANNING OF CONSTRUCTION ON BUILDING 'TEAR DOWN' LOTS, OF NEW STRUCTURES WHICH ARE MORE THAN 20% LARGER THAN THE DEMOLISHED STRUCTURES AND RELATED IMPERVIOUS MATERIAL; b) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall have public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems located and constructed to minimize flood damage; c) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall have adequate drainage provided to reduce exposure to flood damage; and, d) Base flood elevation data shall be provided for subdivision proposals and other proposed new development which contain AT LEAST FIVE (5) LOTS OR TWO (2) ACRES (whichever is less).  
ORIGINAL OF THE LAST SENTENCE ABOVE: at least fifty (50) lots or five (5) acres (whichever is less).

Ms. Stockton said that Council should consider adopting the ordinance as it is in order to comply with federal regulations.

Paul Driscoll, Harris Road, said that he was in agreement with Ms. Sinden and asked that Council give consideration to the suggestions.

Mayor Lempert said that any amendments will push the ordinance adoption to a future meeting. She asked that the Engineering staff look at the proposed amendments and bring back an amending ordinance if necessary.

Sec. 14A-5.1-4. Subdivision proposals a) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall be consistent with the need to minimize flood damage, INCLUDING THE BANNING OF CONSTRUCTION ON BUILDING "TEAR DOWN" LOTS, OF NEW STRUCTURES WHICH ARE MORE THAN 20% LARGER THAN THE DEMOLISHED STRUCTURES AND RELATED IMPERVIOUS MATERIAL; b) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall have public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems located and constructed to minimize flood damage; c) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall have adequate drainage provided to reduce exposure to flood damage; and, d) Base flood elevation data shall be provided for subdivision proposals and other proposed new development which contain

AT LEAST FIVE (5) LOTS OR TWO (2) ACRES (whichever is less).


In reference to Ordinance 2016-33, I would like to recommend certain modifications. I agree with Grace Sinden whose emailed comments to Mayor and Council I have received and would like to affirm in my own name for the record. The 3 recommendation are inserted in **in red**.

- 1) On page 3, under "Development" please add **"removal of trees"** to other factors listed.
- 2) On page 13 in Sec. 14A-5.1-4 please note two suggested modifications inserted **in red**.

Sec. 14A-5,1-4 a) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall be consistent with the need to minimize flood damage, **including the banning of construction on building "tear down" lots, of new structures which are more than 20% larger than the demolished structures and related impervious materials;** b) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall have public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical and water systems located and constructed to minimize flood damage; and, d) Base flood elevation data shall be provided for subdivision proposals and other proposed new development which contain **at least (5) lots or two (2) acres (whichever is less) --which replaces the original wording of "at least (50) lots of five (5) acres (whichever is less).**

As someone who lives in an area with a high water table, I have on more than one occasion experienced the high cost of water damage and would like these changes to be entered into the record.







# Main Meeting Room Audio Visual Upgrade Project

## Current issues with system

- ▶ Current system is 15 years old
- ▶ Most equipment is end of life and cannot be repaired
- ▶ System cannot handle High Definition, in presentations or broadcasting
- ▶ Projector lift motor is dying
- ▶ Only have VGA capability for computers
- ▶ Screen cannot be raised or it will get stuck in the ceiling
- ▶ Control touch panels are not functioning properly and are no longer made. (last one bought on EBay)
- ▶ Audio mixers have to be sent to factory to be repaired causing system downtime
- ▶ System needs to reboot prior to each meeting to function properly



# Survey Results

- ▶ Major Concern is HVAC Audio
  - ▶ This has been an issue since we opened this building, will work with Engineering Department to see what we can do.
- ▶ Video Conferencing split 3 would like it added 3 feel not necessary
- ▶ Everyone would like to keep monitors on the dais
- ▶ Additional comments from survey
  - ▶ Would like monitors added on the side wall, which would show agenda
  - ▶ Ability to project from the dais
  - ▶ Better video capture of off-dais displays such as items on easels or wall
  - ▶ Live streaming of meetings with bookmarks to agenda items
  - ▶ Consideration to automatic transcription

## 2016 YEAR TO DATE ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS





## 2016 YEAR TO DATE ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS






