Mayor Trotman called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M. and read the open public meetings statement as follows:

“This meeting is called to order pursuant to the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Law. This meeting of May 25, 2010, was included in a list of meetings sent to and advertised in the Princeton Packet and Trenton Times, posted on the bulletin board in the Borough of Princeton municipal building and has remained continuously posted as the required notices under the statute. In addition a copy of this notice is and has been available to the public and is on file in the Office of the Borough Clerk. Proper notice having been given, the Borough Clerk is directed to include this statement in the minutes of this meeting.”

Mayor Trotman read **Agenda Item C, Resolution 2010-R164**, as follows:

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act, P.L. 1975, Chapter 231 permits the exclusion of the public forum from a meeting in certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, this public body is of the opinion that such circumstances may presently exist; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body wishes to discuss the following issues:

WHEREAS, minutes will be kept and once the matter involving confidentiality of the above no longer requires that confidentiality, then minutes can be made public; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the public be excluded from this meeting.

Councilwoman Trelstad moved to approve; Councilman Goldfarb seconded. Council members Koontz, Crumiller, Goldfarb, Martindell, Trelstad, and Wilkes voted in the affirmative. Hearing no nay votes, Mayor Trotman proclaimed the resolution approved.

Borough Council recessed into closed session.

At 7:40 P.M. Council reconvened into open session.

Mayor Trotman asked all present to rise for **Agenda Item D, Salute to the Flag.**

Mayor Trotman read **Agenda Item E, Approval of Minutes.**

Presented for approval were the minutes of the open session of April 27, 2010.

Councilwoman Trelstad moved to approve the minutes of the open session of April 27, 2010, Councilwoman Crumiller seconded, and Council approved unanimously.

Mayor Trotman read **Agenda Item F, Public Presentation,** and asked if anyone present wished to address Council with an issue not on the agenda.

Councilman Martindell reported the status of 205 Nassau Street to be nearly complete. He addressed a personal apology to Borough Administrator Robert Bruschi for comments quoted in the press.

Mayor Trotman declared recognition from the Arbor Day Foundation for Princeton Borough again being named a "Tree City USA" for 2009.

Seeing no one further, Mayor Trotman closed the public portion.

Mayor Trotman read **Agenda Item G, Report (1) — Monthly Police Report — David J. Dudeck, Chief of Police.**

**RESOLUTION 2010-R165
OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL
OF THE BOROUGH OF PRINCETON
APPROVING THE MONTHLY CHIEF OF POLICE REPORT**

WHEREAS, David Dudeck, Chief of Police of the Borough of Princeton prepared a comprehensive report detailing the police activity for the month of March 2010; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council reviewed said report at their Regular Meeting attended by Police Chief David Dudeck and made various inquiries of Chief Dudeck.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council hereby accept the March 2010 Monthly police report prepared by the Borough Police Administration.

Chief Dudeck announced distribution of police-endorsed identification cards for residents of Princeton Borough and Princeton Township.

Chief Dudeck noted high morale in the police department due to hiring and promotion processes.

Councilman Wilkes moved to accept the police report, Council President Koontz seconded, and Council approved unanimously.

Mayor Trotman read by title **Agenda Item H, New Business (1) — Introduction and Order to Publish: Ordinance 2010-06** AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 15 OF THE BOROUGH OF PRINCETON, NEW JERSEY 1974 REGARDING “GARBAGE AND REFUSE.”

Mr. Bruschi commented that staff needs to examine the topic of “general municipal waste” after discussion by Council.

Council President Koontz said Council should forward their thoughts to Princeton Regional Health Commission Officer David Henry.

Councilwoman Trelstad, Councilman Goldfarb, and Councilman Wilkes sought to clarify some of the language in Ordinance 2010-06.

Council President Koontz moved to refer Ordinance 2010-06 to the health commission for consideration. Councilwoman Trelstad seconded. Council approved unanimously.

Mayor Trotman read by title **Agenda Item H, New Business (2) — Introduction and Order to Publish: Ordinance 2010-07** AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 16 OF THE BOROUGH OF PRINCETON, NEW JERSEY 1974 REGARDING “HOUSING.”

Council President Koontz moved to refer Ordinance 2010-07 to the health commission for consideration. Councilman Martindell seconded. Council approved unanimously.

Mayor Trotman read **Agenda Item H, New Business (3) — Resolution 2010-R166** as follows:

**RESOLUTION 2010-R166
OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL
OF THE BOROUGH OF PRINCETON
APPROVING THE APPOINTMENT OF
LIEUTENANT NICHOLAS SUTTER AS POLICE CAPTAIN
EFFECTIVE MAY 25, 2010**

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 26-5 of the Code of the Borough of Princeton, there is hereby created a police department which shall consist of administrative personnel including a Chief of Police, a Captain and two Lieutenants; and

WHEREAS, there is currently a vacancy in the position of police Captain; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Princeton wish to fill the position of police Captain; and

WHEREAS, The Public Safety Committee does hereby recommend to Mayor and Council the appointment of Lieutenant Nicholas Sutter to Police Captain; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Sutter has demonstrated the aptitude to be promoted to Captain and is therefore eligible for promotion to Police Captain effective May 25, 2010;

May 25, 2010

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council do hereby confirm the promotion of Lieutenant Nicholas Sutter to the position of Police Captain of the Princeton Borough Police Department effective on this date of May 25, 2010.

Councilman Wilkes moved to approve Resolution 2010-R166 and Councilwoman Trelstad seconded.

Councilman Goldfarb commented that selection of a police captain was complicated by presence of two capable lieutenants.

Councilwoman Trelstad asked the status of identifying a candidate for the newly open lieutenancy. Councilman Wilkes replied that Public Safety Committee has adopted a procedure for promotion from within. Interviews, testing, and so forth will take place late July to early August 2010.

Councilman Martindell noted that extra funds will be required to pay higher-grade officers. Councilman Goldfarb stated that the increase will represent only the salary increment from one lieutenant to one captain.

Council President Koontz asked if examination of the detective bureau staffing is also ongoing and Councilman Wilkes answered that the detectives will be on an agenda soon.

Councilman Martindell opposed a promotion to captaincy on the basis of timing—currently a serious financial situation for Borough. Councilman Martindell thought then-Lieutenant Sutter could have performed all the same functions through delegation by the chief. Councilman Martindell said Borough might lose an opportunity by reacting too quickly; in particular, a larger candidate pool for captain (and presumptive next chief) in a few years.

Councilman Goldfarb said he had favored restoring the position of captain when late Chief Federico announced his intention to retire.

Mayor Trotman called the question and Borough Council approved five to one. Councilman Martindell voted against.

Mayor Trotman read by title **Agenda Item H, New Business (4) — Resolution 2010-R167** as follows:

WHEREAS, On April 29, 2010, the Borough of Princeton Public Safety Committee conducted interviews with candidates for potential openings that may occur in the Princeton Borough Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Princeton Public Safety Committee made recommendation to Mayor and Council to establish a patrol officer hiring list for future openings that may occur in the police department; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Princeton hereby approve establishing a hiring list

subject to future decisions by Borough Council concerning police department staffing; and

WHEREAS, the following candidates comprise the hiring list:

Michael Schubert
Darwin Kieffer
Lucas Schwab;
and

WHEREAS, said hiring list is effective for a period of one year.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Chief of Police, the Borough Administrator and the Public Safety Committee.

Council President Koontz moved to approve Resolution 2010-R167 and Councilman Wilkes seconded.

Councilman Wilkes explained that the list encompasses three finalists from the large initial applicant pool. Public Safety recommends placing these candidates on the hiring list in this order.

Mr. Bruschi said Public Safety will evaluate strategies for an active hiring list.

Councilman Martindell opposed developing a hiring list without a list of police programs and staffing needs.

Councilwoman Trelstad agreed that Council needs a public discussion of what Borough's police force should do.

Mayor Trotman offered to schedule a public discussion of police force profile and duties during June 2010 if possible.

Councilman Goldfarb stated that these hires are necessary to meet minimal staffing needs.

Councilman Martindell mentioned three areas of possible police work to cover publicly—(1) alarms, (2) state mandates, and (3) shared services.

Council President Koontz stated that Council already thoroughly discussed police patrols and defined a clear policy for staffing patrol activities. Detective bureau and other police matters should be Council's next concern.

Chief Dudeck welcomed a discussion about how Borough government and citizens want the police to function.

Hearing no further discussion, Mayor Trotman called for a vote. Mayor Trotman proclaimed the motion passed five to one. Councilman Martindell voted nay.

Mayor Trotman read Agenda **Item H, New Business (5) — Resolution 2010-R168** as follows:

WHEREAS, the Borough of Princeton (the “Borough”) desires to enter into a settlement agreement with Officer James Dodd to resolve any and all outstanding issues that may exist between the parties.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Princeton, as follows:

1. The Borough is authorized to enter into a settlement agreement with Officer James Dodd pursuant to the terms contained therein.

Councilwoman Trelstad moved to approve Resolution 2010-R168 and Councilman Wilkes seconded.

Councilman Martindell observed that settlement issues raised are not subject to rigorous followup to determine whether Borough policies and practices must be reviewed or changed; in particular, disputes with police officers do not consider:

1. Personnel management practices
2. Interests of residents affected by police action
3. Cost.

Hearing no further discussion, Mayor Trotman called for a vote. Mayor Trotman proclaimed the motion passed five to one. Councilman Martindell voted nay.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Princeton (the “Borough”) desires to enter into a rights-of-way use agreement (“Use Agreement”) with Cablevision Lightpath - NJ, Inc. and its subsidiary company 4Connections LLC (collectively referred to herein as “Lightpath”) with offices located at 200 Jericho Quadrangle, Jericho, New York 11753.

WHEREAS, Cablevision Lightpath — NJ, Inc. was approved by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (“BPU”) to provide local exchange and interexchange telecommunications services throughout the State of New Jersey by Order of Approval in Docket No. TE97120883 on December 5, 1997 and intends to provide telecommunication services in accordance with that Order and the rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission and the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities; and

WHEREAS, 4Connections LLC has been approved by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities to provide local exchange and interexchange telecommunications services throughout the State of New Jersey by Order of Approval in Docket no, TE02010035 on November 5, 2003, and intends to provide telecommunication services in accordance with that Order and the rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission and the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities;

WHEREAS, pursuant to such authority granted by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities, Lightpath may locate, place, attach, install, operate and maintain facilities within Public Rights-of-Way for purposes of providing telecommunications services; and

WHEREAS, Lightpath proposes to place its telecommunication facilities aerially on existing utility poles or in underground conduit in the Public Rights-of-Way within the Borough for the purpose of owning, constructing, installing, operating, repairing and maintaining a telecommunications system; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest for the Borough to promote competition in the telecommunications market and for the Borough to grant consent to Lightpath to occupy said Public Rights-of-Way within the Borough for this purpose; and,

WHEREAS, the consent granted herein is for the non-exclusive use of the Public Rights-of-Way within the Borough for the purpose of owning, constructing, installing, operating, and maintaining a telecommunications system.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Princeton, as follows:

2. Lightpath is hereby granted permission to install, operate and maintain its telecommunications system within the Borough of Princeton in accordance with the routing plan previously provided to the Borough for approval. If there should be any deviation from either the routing plan or method of installation as presently proposed, Lightpath will notify the Borough and post a performance bond for the work, if said bond is determined by the Borough to be required.

3. The Borough, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:3-18 has the authority to enter into the Use Agreement, which attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein in its entirety, with Lightpath for the use of utility poles upon such terms and conditions as agreed upon by the Borough and Lightpath.

4. The installation, operation and maintenance of Lightpath's telecommunications system shall not interfere with the safety or convenience of persons or vehicles traveling on public streets, highways or right-of-way within the Borough.

5. In accordance with the terms of the Use Agreement, Lightpath shall agree to indemnify, save, defend and hold harmless the Borough, and its officers, officials, agents, servants, administrators, and employees, from and against any and all liability or damages arising out of the use of said premises or property.

Councilman Martindell moved to approve Resolution 2010-R169 and Councilwoman Trelstad seconded.

Councilwoman Crumiller asked for dark cable, a benefit to the community. Council members agreed that the vendor must cover Borough legal fees.

Councilman Martindell moved to table Resolution 2010-R169 pending more specific language. Councilwoman Trelstad seconded. Council accepted unanimously.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Princeton (the "Borough") desires to enter into a rights-of-way use agreement ("Use Agreement") with Fiber Technologies Networks, LLC ("Fibertech") with offices located at 300 Meridian Centre, Rochester, New York.

WHEREAS, Fibertech was approved by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("BPU") to provide local exchange and interexchange telecommunications services throughout the State of New Jersey by Order of Approval in Docket No. TE05080683 on September 14, 2005 and intends to provide telecommunication services in accordance with that Order and the rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission and the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to such authority granted by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities, Fibertech may locate, place, attach, install, operate and maintain facilities within Public Rights-of-Way for purposes of providing telecommunications services; and

WHEREAS, Fibertech proposes to place its telecommunication facilities aerially on existing utility poles or in underground conduit in the Public Rights-of-Way within the Borough for the purpose of owning, constructing, installing, operating, repairing and maintaining a telecommunications system; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest for the Borough to promote competition in the telecommunications market and for the Borough to grant consent to Fibertech to occupy said Public Rights-of-Way within the Borough for this purpose; and,

WHEREAS, the consent granted herein is for the non-exclusive use of the Public Rights-of-Way within the Borough for the purpose of owning, constructing, installing, operating, and maintaining a telecommunications system.
