Minutes From December 19, 2012

Mr. Lahnston asked if there were any changes to the Transition Task Force minutes of December 19, 2012. He said that if members had any changes, that they should be submitted to Ms. Persichetti by the end of the week and the minutes as corrected will be posted on the CGR website as corrected.

Status Update On Transition Task Force Recommendations

Mr. Bruschi offered a power point presentation as a status update on the TTF recommendations. He said that the TTF outlined 35 beyond day one items that should remain on the radar of the governing body and that administration.

Mr. Bruschi said that he wished that there was more time for "Team Building" and that periodic department head and management team meetings were held.

Mr. Bruschi and Council reviewed priority items noting that some transition items are more labor intensive than others such as Information and Technology projects.

It was reported that a goal setting session would be held in January/February and the currently 97 goals have been completed to date.

Mr. Bruschi said that the Personnel Manual would be ready to be presented at the Council Meeting of June 24, 2013.

Mr. Levine asked that another look be taken at the medical retirement program.

Mr. Davis asked that we continue to work on Boards and Commissions.

Ms. Moore asked that the new municipality make an effort to become more transparent. She also asked that Council watch attorney expenses and how it is budgeted.

Ms. Trelstad said that commercial garbage collection is still a problem and needs to be looked at.

Mr. Lahnston noted that Sergeant Thomas Murray has done a fabulous job with the police traffic division. He also thanked the community and people who worked with the Consolidation Study Commission and the Transition Task Force.

Mr. Singer commended the three bodies for having this public meeting.

Report To State Of Lessons Learned



