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## IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING MOUNT LUCAS ROADWAY WORK

### FINAL PAVING NOTICE FOR MOUNT LUCAS ROAD BETWEEN LAUREL ROAD AND VALLEY ROAD

On Friday, October 9<sup>th</sup>, weather permitting, the contractor plans to install the final surface pavement on Mount Lucas Road between just south of the 66 Mount Lucas Road parking area and Valley Road; Cherry Hill Road between Route 206 and Mount Lucas Road; and Terhune Road between Route 206 and Mount Lucas Road. The contractor will start on Mount Lucas Road, just south of 66 Mount Lucas Road at 7 am. In order to provide for this work, Mount Lucas Road will be closed from Jefferson Road to Cherry Hill Road and Laurel Road at Mount Lucas Road during the hours of 7 am to approximately 6 pm. The businesses can be accessible from Laurel Road. For 60 Mount Lucas Road, please park in the parking lot for the 66 Mount Lucas Road and walk on the paved roadside path. The bank parking lot will be accessible from Route 206.

At approximately 9 am, when the paving operation reaches Cherry Hill Road, additional closures will be posted as follows: Cherry Hill Road will be closed between Mount Lucas Road and Route 206; Terhune Road will be closed between Jefferson Road and Route 206 and Mount Lucas Road will be closed between Valley Road and Jefferson Road during the hours of 9 am to approximately 6 pm. If you require use of your vehicle on Friday, please remove your vehicle from your driveway by 7 am and park in a legal parking space on a roadway outside of these paving limits. Provisions will be made for mail delivery, emergency services vehicles and school busses. Please refrain from any pedestrian foot traffic across the new pavement during work hours, as the pavement surface is very hot and susceptible to marring.

After the final paving of the roadway is completed, the roadway may not be driven upon for a 2-hour period up until approximately 6 pm. This restriction will prevent permanent damage to the pavement during its "curing period". Residents will then be allowed to return to their driveways once the road is opened. In the event of inclement weather, the work will proceed on the following day.
