IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING MOUNT LUCAS ROADWAY WORK

ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT WORK BETWEEN JEFFERSON ROAD AND CHERRY HILL ROAD AND BETWEEN JEFFERSON ROAD AND EWING STREET

On Monday, September 28th, and Tuesday, September 29th, weather permitting, the contractor plans to finish the paving of the driveways at businesses' parking lots on Mount Lucas Road between Laurel Road and Cherry Hill Road. Also, the contractor plans to mill the Jefferson Road and Mount Lucas Road intersection, mill Cherry Hill Road between Mount Lucas Road and Route 206 and mill and pave Laurel Road between Mount Lucas Road and Jefferson Road. **In order to provide for this work, Mount Lucas Road will be closed to through traffic from Jefferson Road to Cherry Hill Road and Laurel Road between Mount Lucas Road and Jefferson Road during working hours of 7 am to approximately 6 pm. While the milling work is proceeding in the intersections of Mount Lucas Road and Cherry Hill Road and Mount Lucas Road and Jefferson Road, additional closures on Jefferson Road and Cherry Hill Road will be posted.**

On Wednesday, September 30th and through Friday, October 2nd, weather permitting, the contractor plans to install top soil and seed in the disturbed areas on Mount Lucas Road between Ewing Street and Cherry Hill Road. **In order to provide for this work, Mount Lucas Road will be closed to through traffic from Jefferson Road to Cherry Hill Road and between Ewing Street and Jefferson Road during working hours of 7 am to approximately 6 pm.** The contractor plans to install final paving on the roadway the following week. Additional notice will be provided.

Should inclement weather occur, the work will proceed the following business day. Mount Lucas Road will reopen at the end of each work day. Residents are advised to use caution when driving within the road closure area and allow additional time for travel. Provisions will be made for emergency services vehicles and for continued services such as brush collection, mail delivery, garbage and recycling pick-up.
