## **IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING PARK PLACE, VANDEVENTER AVENUE, WILLOW STREET, BRANCH ALLEY, AND MOORE STREET**

Over the next two weeks, weather permitting, driveway restoration, roadway milling, and roadway base paving will take place.

**On Monday, July 15, 2014, the contractor will be completing miscellaneous work including the grading of the roadbed on Branch Alley.**

**On Monday, Princeton Department of Public Works staff will collect branches, brush and logs that have been placed curbside prior to 7:00 am.** Once your street has been completed the crew will NOT be back until the scheduled collections begin in August. Residents that put brush, leaves and other yard debris out after this cleanup may be subject to a violation notice and enforcement.

**On Tuesday, July 15, 2014, final driveway restoration throughout the project limits is expected to begin at 7:00 am and is anticipated to be completed by the end of Friday, July 18, weather permitting.** During this time, residents should be prepared to remove vehicles from their driveways. Vehicles should not be parked near or across from driveways in order to allow access for the paving machines. Access to driveways will be restricted after the work is completed to allow the asphalt to cool and set; it is recommended that you not drive your vehicle over the asphalt for a 24 hour period to allow it to cure.

**On Tuesday, July 15, 2014, the contractor may also begin milling the existing roadway and installing pavement on Willow Street.** If the work begins at 7:00 am, it is anticipated to be completed by the end of the day, weather permitting. Residents are asked to remove vehicles from their driveways beginning on Monday night or early Tuesday morning, prior to the start of work. Residents will not be permitted to park vehicles in Willow Street due to the work being performed on the roadway. Willow Street condominium residents may have access to their driveways at the end of the day. If this schedule changes, we will send out an email notice on Tuesday.

**In the event of inclement weather, the work will proceed on the following work day.**

Residents will be allowed to park on Madison Street, Spruce Street, Moore Street, or other non-metered, legal parking spaces where work is not taking place. Affected residents are

advised to display a yellow parking placard in their vehicles. Free overnight parking is available at the following locations:

- The Spring Street Garage (upon validation by parking garage staff) for those vehicles displaced by construction. In order to use this opportunity, please email the following information to Bill Moraski, Parking Superintendent, at [bmoraski@princetonnj.gov](mailto:bmoraski@princetonnj.gov): your name, address, cell phone number, and make / model / license plate number. If you need to park your car on the street overnight, please contact Deanna Stockton, [dstockton@princetonnj.gov](mailto:dstockton@princetonnj.gov), to obtain a temporary parking placard, which must be placed on the dashboard of the driver's side front windshield.
- Saint Paul School lot. If you utilize this option, please adhere to the following conditions:
  - Park behind the school buildings, not the church;
  - Remove your vehicle by 7:00 am; and
  - Place a note or the yellow parking placard on your vehicle's dashboard indicating where you reside and that you are displaced due to construction.

We are working with the service providers to have the collection of garbage, recycling and organics on all of the affected roads take place on your regularly scheduled day between the hours of 6:30 am and 7:00 am. Please place your bins out at the curb by 6:30 am.
