## **IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING PARK PLACE, VANDEVENTER AVENUE, WIGGINS STREET, AND MOORE STREET**

Happy Holidays! Next week, Integrated Construction and Utilities of New Jersey (ICUNJ) will be continuing with the repair and replacement of the sanitary sewer system within Park Place and Lancha Construction will be replacing sidewalks along Vandeventer Avenue. The work is planned as follows:

Monday, weather permitting, Lancha Construction will remove and replace marked sidewalks and driveway aprons on the east side of Vandeventer Avenue starting at Wiggins Street and continuing toward Spring Street / Park Place. This work was delayed due to the cold temperatures and rain that we experienced this week.

Vandeventer Avenue will be closed between Wiggins Street and Spring Street between the hours of 7:00 am and 6:00 pm. Please note, if your sidewalk within your driveway is replaced, you will not be able to access your driveway for a period of 48 to 72 hours after the new concrete is installed. Please see the next page for parking options during this period.

Monday through Friday, Integrated Construction and Utilities of New Jersey (ICUNJ) will be continuing with the repair and replacement of the sanitary sewer system on the east end of Park Place between Madison Street and Moore Street. Sanitary sewer laterals will be installed / replaced from the main in the roadway to the back of sidewalk. However, if you own property on Park Place between these streets and have provided signed authorization, the contractor may be in contact with you to complete your lateral replacement from your building to the sewer main. You will be notified individually if that work is proposed to take place.

The Park Place parking lot will be accessible from Vandeventer Avenue and Park Place (via Madison Street and Vandeventer Avenue) this week during work hours.

Adjacent properties on the affected street(s) will be notified as needed to remove vehicles prior to the start of work each day. Parking will be allowed in non-metered, legal parking spaces on other municipal roads where work will not be taking place. If you need to park your car on the street overnight, please contact Chris Knigge, [cknigge@princetonnj.gov](mailto:cknigge@princetonnj.gov), to obtain a

temporary parking placard, which must be placed on the dashboard of the driver's side front windshield.

If you will not have access to your property because of the sidewalk or sanitary sewer work, you may be able to park for free (upon validation by parking garage staff) at the Spring Street garage. In order to use this opportunity, please email the following information to Bill Moraski, Parking Superintendent, at [bmoraski@princetonnj.gov](mailto:bmoraski@princetonnj.gov): your name, address, cell phone number, and make / model / license plate number.

Provisions will be made for continued services such as mail delivery, garbage and recycling pick-up. The road will be reopened to full two-way traffic and parking at the end of each work day.
