IMPORTANT NOTICE

Dear Ewing Street Neighborhood Residents:

As per the discussion at the Neighborhood Pre-construction Meeting on November 12, 2012, the Township of Princeton previously contracted with Top Line Construction to perform roadway improvements and sanitary sewer rehabilitation work within Ewing Street, between Valley Road and North Harrison Street.

One of the components of this project is the replacement of the sanitary sewer laterals. This work will consist of the replacement of your sewer lateral (a lateral is the sanitary sewer pipe from your house to the sewer main in the road) in the public road right-of-way and the placement of a cleanout or inspection port at your property line.

After installing the cleanout, Top Line Construction, in accordance with the Contract Documents, will perform, if not previously completed, a closed-circuit television inspection of the lateral from the location of the cleanout towards your home. Within a couple of days of completing the inspection, you will be provided with a letter outlining the inspection results, any defects found as defined by the Ordinance, and whether or not any repairs or replacement work is required.

If you have already authorized work on your private property, this work will be concurrent with the work on your sanitary sewer lateral in the road right-of-way.

Upon the completion of the lateral work, both in the road right-of-way and on private property, the site will be restored. Final restoration on private property may not occur until completion of the entire project.

The replacement of your lateral will require the temporary disconnection of your service for approximately four (4) hours. During this period, please do not use the toilets, sinks, showers and laundry drains. Backups from your sanitary sewer into your home may occur if any amount of water is used. Also, sump pumps, roof leaders and area drains that are connected to the sanitary sewer must be disconnected from those lines. Such connections are illegal and must be removed. In addition, when your sanitary sewer service is temporarily cut off, these illegal connections will cause a backup into your home.

The contractor will begin to mobilize equipment and materials to the area on the week of January 7, 2013, and the sanitary sewer lateral replacement portion of the work will follow, which is anticipated to take six (6) weeks to complete, weather permitting.


YOU WILL RECEIVE A SECOND NOTICE STATING EXACTLY WHEN YOUR LATERAL WILL BE REPLACED AND SPECIFICALLY WHEN YOUR SERVICE WILL BE DISCONNECTED AND TEMPORARILY OUT OF USE.

Daily working hours are expected to be between 7:00 AM and 4:30 PM. When working on Ewing Street, the road will be closed except for local traffic. Normal services such as mail delivery, garbage collection, etc. will not be disrupted.

Once the sanitary sewer work is completed, the storm drainage improvements will be installed followed by the road improvements. All work is anticipated to be completed by June 15th, weather permitting.
