Dear Landowner,

As you may be aware, Williams operates a natural gas transmission pipeline in your community known as Transcontinental Gas Pipe Line (Transco), which transports much of the natural gas consumed in your region. In December you received a letter from Williams announcing the proposed Leidy South East Project; we want to keep you informed of recent steps in the project.

The regulatory process

Williams has initiated an environmental pre-filing review of the project with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), the federal agency that regulates natural gas pipelines like the Williams' Transco pipeline. Information on the Pre-filing environmental review process and the Leidy South East Project may be accessed on the FERC's web site at FERC.gov, under docket number PF 13-5 or by e-mailing the FERC at: customer@ferc.gov or by calling the FERC Office of External Affairs, Toll-free at: 1-866-208-3372. Be sure to include the docket number PF13-5 in any correspondence to the FERC.

Before Williams can modify its facilities, the company must obtain a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity from the FERC. The final facility design, location and other details of the proposal have not yet been determined and a formal application has not yet been filed with the FERC. The environmental pre-filing review is a step in the information gathering process.

Project description

The project is a proposed expansion of the Transco Mainline and Leidy systems in Pennsylvania and New Jersey. The proposed project scope includes new pipeline facilities, additional compression, and facility modifications. In your area, Williams anticipates the project will require construction of approximately 6.36 miles of new 42-inch pipeline or "loop" (new pipeline laid parallel to existing lines) in Montgomery Township in Somerset County, and Princeton Township in Mercer County, NJ. Field Studies

Company personnel and consultants will begin accessing the company's existing right of way and seeking permission to access nearby properties in early 2013 in order to conduct civil, environmental and cultural surveys.

The process of conducting these surveys involves several steps. Generally, each property will be visited by various specialists in engineering, cultural and environmental sciences. These may or may not be concurrent visits but should not last longer than one or two days each. Some properties may need to be revisited to obtain additional data. All information collected will be used to help us determine the location of the proposed pipeline facilities that will result in the least impact to the environment and the community.

After the survey teams are finished you may see survey stakes and/or ribbon tied to fences or vegetation. These markers are necessary to maintain a line of sight for the areas that have been surveyed. In areas where brush or tall grass is encountered, crews may need to cut some of this vegetation to maintain the line of sight. Some minor surface disturbance may be required with hand tools for cultural resource surveys. Our survey crews will take every precaution to ensure no damage to your property or disruption of your daily activities will occur.

Next Steps

Land agents representing Williams have begun contacting landowners in recent weeks to provide more information about the project and schedule meetings with you. These contacts are ongoing. If you have not yet been contacted, you will be in next few weeks. Your input is important to us and Williams is committed to working with you to ensure that any questions or concerns are promptly addressed. Williams will hold public meetings in your area in the spring to seek input about the project from the community. You will be notified of the date and location of these meetings.
