

**2016-07 AN ORDINANCE BY PRINCETON
REGULATING METERED ON-STREET
PARKING ALONG PAUL ROBESON
PLACE AND AMENDING THE “CODE OF
THE BOROUGH OF PRINCETON, NEW
JERSEY, 1974”**

WHEREAS, the “Code of the Borough of Princeton, New Jersey, 1974” designates on Paul Robeson Place, between Chambers Street and Witherspoon Street, metered on-street parking on the north and south sides of the roadway; and

WHEREAS, the Traffic Safety Committee reviewed a request by the Palmer Square Management to relocate metered on-street parking spaces to increase sight distance at the Palmer Square Residences garage exit; and

WHEREAS, Princeton Police Department and Engineering Department staff endorse the removal of one metered on-street parking space on the south side of the road and installation of two new metered on-street parking spaces on the north side of the road; and

WHEREAS, the existing limits of the Paul Robeson Place on-street metered parking zones are not accurately depicted in the “Code of the Borough of Princeton, New Jersey, 1974”.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of Princeton as follows:

Section 1. Section 19-24 of the “Code of the Borough of Princeton, New Jersey, 1974” (“Code”) designates metered on-street parking zones and times by street and is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 19-24. Metered on-street parking zones

(d) Parking time limited to two hours.

(3) Type two meters. No person shall park a vehicle for longer than two hours at any time between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M., Monday through Saturday, and between the hours of 1:00 P.M. and 8:00 P.M., Sunday, upon any of the following streets or parts of streets:

Paul Robeson Place, south side, from a point two hundred twenty feet east of Chambers Street to a point one hundred seventy-five feet west of Witherspoon Street.

(f) Parking time limited to ten hours.

(3) Type three meters. No person shall park a vehicle for longer than ten hours at any time between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M., Monday through Saturday, upon any of the following streets or parts of streets:

Paul Robeson Place, north side, from a point one hundred forty feet west of Witherspoon Street to a point one hundred ninety-five feet east of John Street.

Section 2. Section 19-22(a) of the “Code”, which designates “no parking at any time” zones, and is hereby amended as follows:

Paul Robeson Place, north side, from Route NJ 206 (Bayard Lane) to a point one hundred ninety-five feet east of John Street and from Witherspoon Street to a point one hundred forty feet westerly.

Paul Robeson Place, south side, from Chambers Street to a point two hundred twenty feet easterly and from Witherspoon Street to a point one hundred seventy-five feet westerly.

Paul Robeson Place, south side, from Route NJ 206 (Bayard Lane) to Chambers Street.

Section 3. All ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance are repealed.

Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion thereof.

Section 5. The appropriate parking signs shall be posted, and parking meters removed and installed, to implement the requirements of this Ordinance.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication and shall become part of the new Princeton Code once completed and adopted.

The purpose of the ordinance is to amend the metered on-street parking zones on Paul Robeson Place to remove one (1) two-hour type two metered parking space from the south side of the roadway and replace it with two (2) ten-hour type three metered parking spaces on the north side of the roadway as endorsed by the Princeton Police Department, and to correct the limits of the Paul Robeson Place parking zones between Chambers Street and Witherspoon Street.
