

### **Juvenile Report June 2015**

#### **Juveniles Petitioned to Family Court**

A seventeen year old male was charged with Possession of Marijuana after he was located in a vehicle in Community Park South when the park was closed.

A fifteen year old boy was charged with Burglary, Unlawful Possession of a Weapon and Possession of a Weapon for Unlawful Purpose after he entered a home with an air soft gun with the intention of stealing. The resident found him hiding under his bed and the juvenile was subsequently charged and lodged in the Middlesex County Youth Detention Center.

#### **Family Crisis/Juvenile Mental Health Crisis**

A fourteen year old female was transported to the hospital for psychological evaluation at the request of her parents after acting out by throwing objects and threatening to run away.

A 17 year old male threw a party while his parents were away and unaware. A 911 call from an unknown person at the party initiated a police response and as a result an 18 year old female was transported to the hospital to be treated for severe intoxication. The homeowners were advised about host liability issues and offered contact information for Corner House for their son and the female's family was given a referral to Corner House. No charges were filed as it occurred on private property.

A police search ensued for a four year old girl who was reported missing from her home. She was located unharmed under a piece of furniture in her home within an hour of the time she went missing.



# Total Arrests








# Dispatch Overtime



- ❖ On Monday, June 1, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted an explosives sweep at the Princeton University Chapel, as well as Cannon Green, at the request of Princeton University Public Safety for their Class Day Ceremony. They were assisted by a K-9 team from the Mercer County Sheriff's Department.
- ❖ On Tuesday, June 2, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted an explosives sweep on Nassau Green at the request of Princeton University Public Safety for their Commencement Ceremony. They were assisted by two K-9 teams from the Mercer County Sheriff's Department.
- ❖ On Tuesday, June 2, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted an explosives sweep at Nassau Hall at the request of Princeton University Public Safety for their ROTC Commissioning Ceremony. The event was attended by Gen. Mark A. Milley, presidential nomination for the United States Army Chief of Staff.
- ❖ From June 8<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup>, Cpl. Solovay assisted with the initial interview phase for the police hiring process.
- ❖ On Tuesday, June 9, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris attended in-service training for the New Jersey Detect and Render Safe Task Force. The training was hosted by the Princeton Police Department and conducted by the New Jersey State Police as well as other state certified K-9 Scent Trainers from various agencies. For the training, the task force received permission and utilized the facilities in and around the Princeton University Stadium.
- ❖ On Thursday, June 11, 2015, Cpl. Solovay attended a meeting in regards to "Swatting" which was hosted by the Princeton Police Department. Speakers from the New Jersey State Police and the Federal Bureau of Investigation provided insight to the "Swatting" incidents and advised police agencies of investigative measures they can take in order to combat these disturbing threats.

- ❖ On Friday, June 19, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris participated in the official graduation ceremony from the New Jersey State Police K-9 Academy Patrol Class # 15. Although, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris successfully completed the training in January 2015, the New Jersey State Police holds the graduation ceremony in June, in conjunction with K-9 scent training graduation. Cpl. Solovay was selected as Class Speaker and gave a speech in regards to the training experience and the roles of police K-9's in modern day policing. Also, Sgt. Fred Williams of the Princeton Police Department created a video presentation which chronicled the training of Patrol Class # 15, which was viewed by the attendees of the graduation.
  
- ❖ From June 22<sup>nd</sup>-24<sup>th</sup>, Cpl. Solovay attended the Police Expo in Atlantic City, NJ. Cpl. Solovay and other department members attended lectures dealing with Law Enforcement's Response to Civil Disturbance in America and The Boston Marathon Bombing: Lessons Learned.
  
- ❖ On Friday, June 26, 2015, Cpl. Solovay and K-9 Harris conducted an explosives sweep at the request of the United States Secret Service on the Princeton University Campus for the visit of President Barack Obama's Daughter, Malia Obama.
