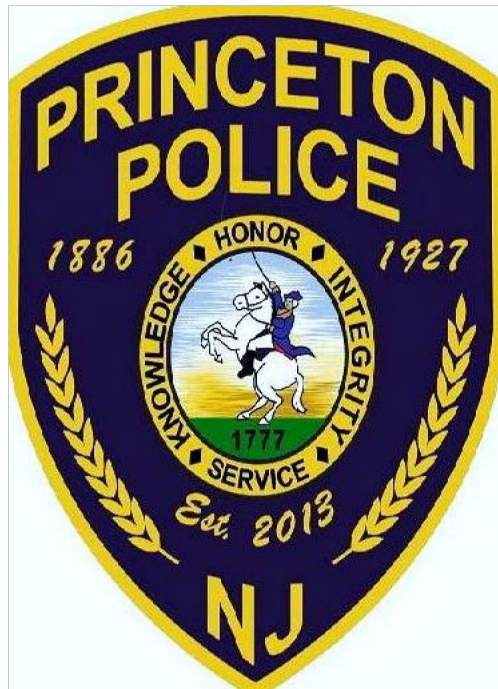

## **Juvenile Report September 2020**

**Juvenile Petitioned to Family Court** 0

**Station House Adjustment** 0

### **Curb Side Warnings**

Patrol responded to a call of juveniles skateboarding on private property. Upon their arrival, they met with 2 fifteen year old boys and 2 sixteen year old boys. The boys apologized and stated they did not know it was private property. Patrol notified their parents of the incident. (20-22172)

Patrol responded to a call where juveniles rang the doorbell and then ran away. Patrol located 2 fifteen year old boys who admitted to ringing doorbells and running away. No damage was done, Patrol contacted the parents, a parent responded and picked up both boys. (20-22686)

### **Juvenile Family Crisis**

The father of a sixteen year old boy called our department to report that he was out of control and throwing things throughout the residence. Upon patrol arrival, the boy was calm. The boy had become upset when his parents grounded him and he threw several breakable items around his room as a result. No one was injured, however, his father asked that he be transported to the hospital for a psychological evaluation. PFARS transported him to the hospital without incident. (20-21842)

A seventeen year old male was reported missing by his mother after he was found to have violated his probation. He was subsequently found in Newton, PA. Newton PD agreed to meet Princeton PD in Yardley, PA. Princeton PD picked him up, transported him home where he was reunited with his mother. (20-22434)

### **Juvenile Incidents**

A six year old boy's mother reported him missing after his father violated their custody agreement and took him from a campsite in Newton, PA where he was on vacation with his aunt. After several phone calls from different police agencies the father returned the boy to his mother. The father stated he took the boy due to a child abuse allegation that his uncle hit him. DCP&P was also contacted and is investigating. (20-21477)

Patrol responded to Princeton High School (PHS) on the report of a burglar alarm activation. Upon arrival, they made contact with a sixteen year old boy who explained that he was playing basketball to "blow off steam" after he lost a game earlier that evening. After speaking with Assistant Principal Rashone Johnson, he stated that the school would handle this incident internally. (20-23038)

## **Safe Neighborhood Bureau Monthly Report** **September 2020**

During the month of September, the Safe Neighborhood Unit focused on creative ways to connect with the community while practicing safe engagement. We conducted bicycle patrols past schools operating in-person during recess, arrival, and dismissal times. We engaged in social distanced conversation with the students and staff. We participated in outdoor “Back-to-School” events with great giveaways all while donning masks and practicing “air high fives”. We resumed committee meetings with video conferences and helped others in-person when necessary. We also ran two donation drives: one for toiletries and one for school supplies. All proceeds went to the Princeton Cornerstone Community Kitchen “store”, Princeton Human Services, and the Princeton area students at the YMCA.

### **Activities:**

- ❖ **September 8:** SNB met with Princeton House Security to go over updated security measures.
- ❖ **September 9:** SNB conducted a birthday convoy with members of the Princeton Fire Department and the Princeton First Aid and Rescue Squad.
- ❖ **September 10:** SNB set up another participant in the “Operation Blue Angel Program.
- ❖ **September 15:** SNB participated in the Domestic Violence Liaison County-Wide Quarterly meeting via Zoom.
- ❖ **September 16:** SNB attended the “Back-to-School” drive-by lunch event at the Princeton Care Center, co-hosted by Van Dyck Law.
- ❖ **September 17:** SNB attended re-certification training for Alcotest.
- ❖ **September 21:** SNB attended the Immigration Committee update meeting via Zoom.
- ❖ **September 23:** SNB, in partnership with SAVE Animal Shelter, held a “Pooches on Patrol” adoption event for rescued dogs. SAVE accepts our entire population of abandoned, stray, and lost cats and dogs that we bring to their shelter while on patrol.
- ❖ **September 23:** SNB attended the “Know Your Tenant Rights” webinar, which featured updated tenant-landlord laws.
- ❖ **September 24:** SNB co-sponsored a “Back to School Jam” at the YMCA. We gave out \$500 worth of school supplies that the members of Princeton PBA Local #130 generously funded.

### **Other activities of note:**

SNB performed 20 vacant house checks and conducted 18 community-policing activities. SNB officers assisted PPD patrols as backup on five calls for service and were the primary officers on seven calls for service. SNB officers also installed car seats for community members and completed a number of administrative assignments. As always, the SNB manages all of our social media platforms, which continue to show rising reach, followers, and positive engagements.

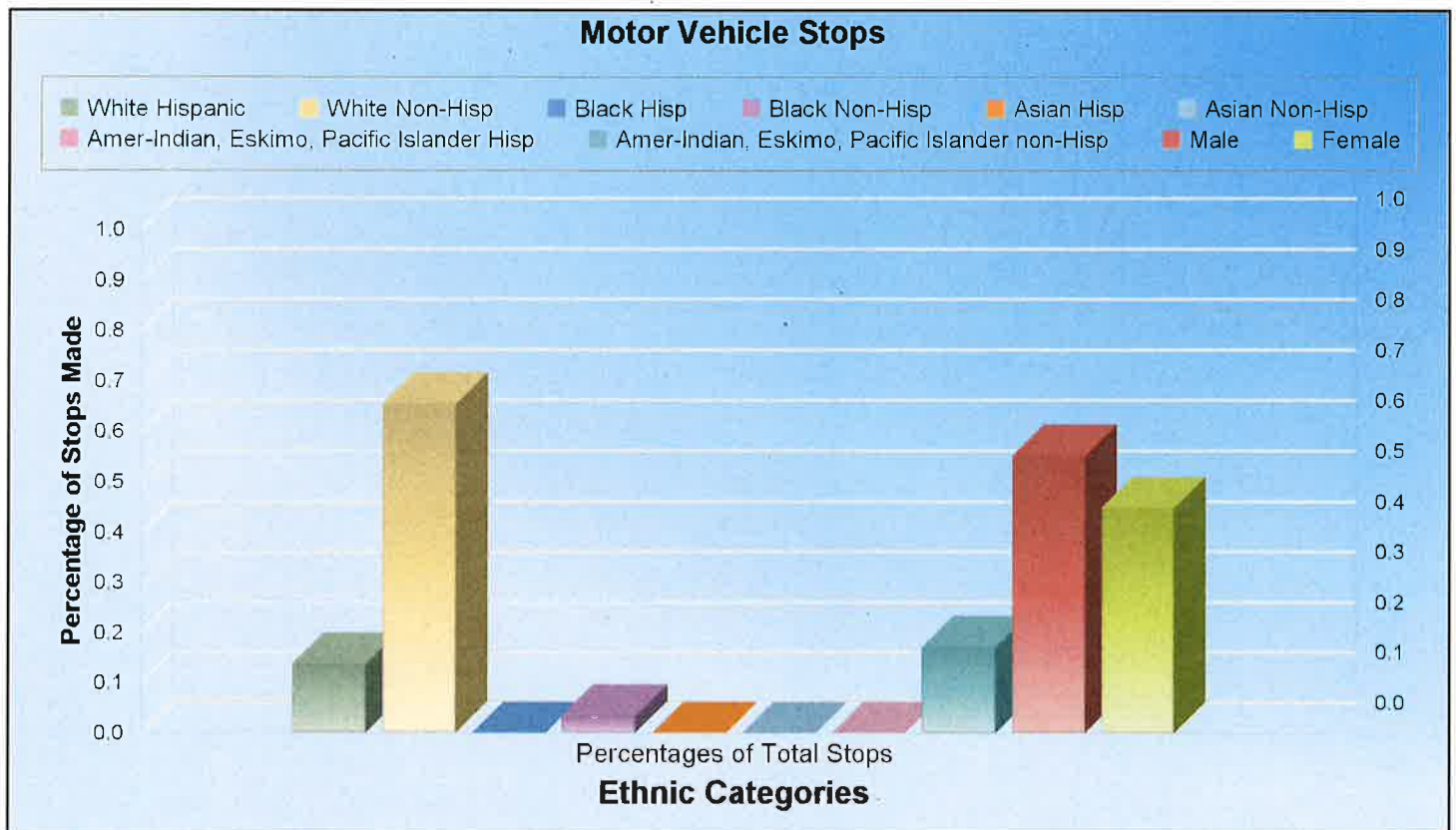

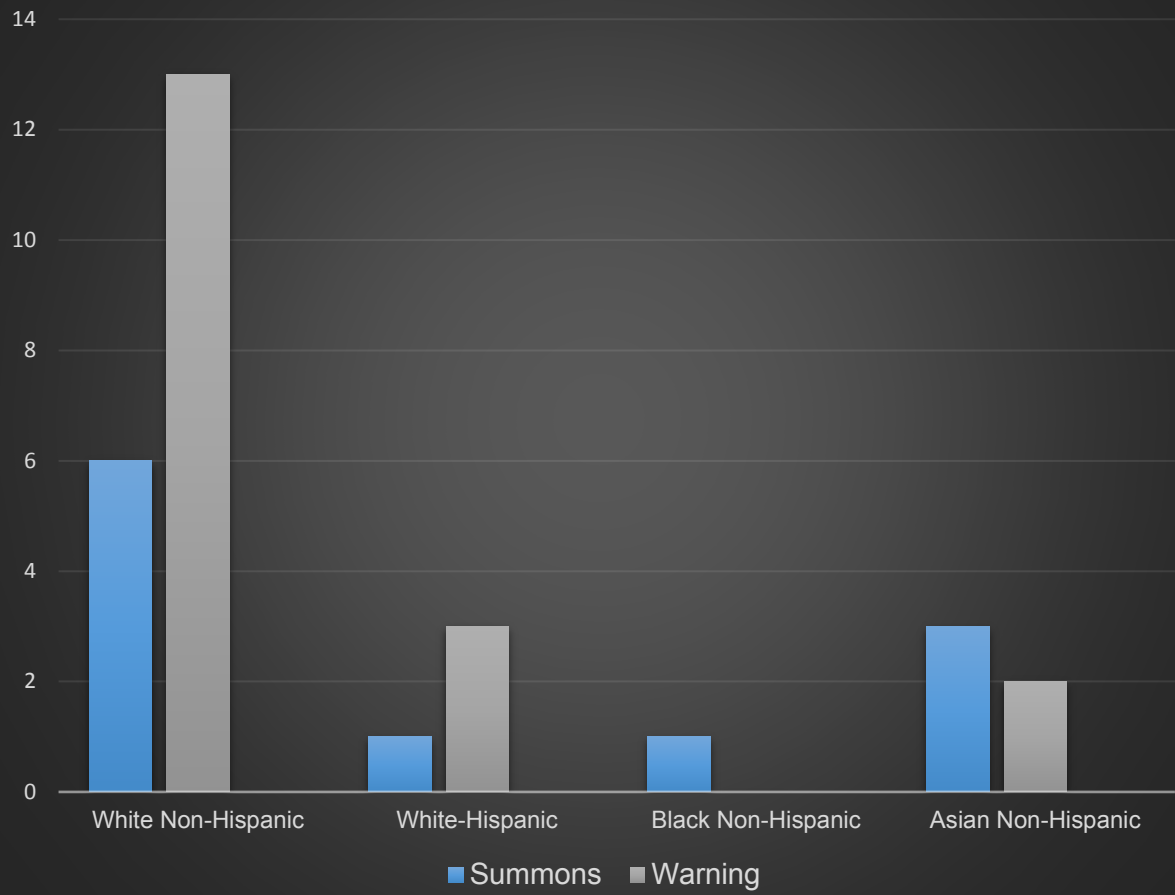
