Resolution for the Establishment of a Task Force on Walkway Safety Concerning Lighting, Tripping Hazards and Crosswalks

WHEREAS, Walking is a sustainable and environmentally friendly mode of transportation that also has enormous benefits for the mental, physical and fiscal health of those who engage in the activity and people of all ages, all socio-economic situations, and all ethnic backgrounds, participate in walking, and

WHEREAS, the Council is dedicated to making Princeton a safe and satisfying pedestrian community,

THEREFORE, Be it Resolved as follows:

The Council establishes a Task Force on Walkway Safety Concerning Lighting, Tripping Hazards and Crosswalks, to address these specific challenges that detract from the walking experience: poor lighting, inadequate crosswalks, and poorly maintained sidewalks, and

The Task Force will issue a set of recommendations to Council by December, 2019.
