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**ROADWAY RESURFACING PROJECT 2023
IMPORTANT NOTICE
MAY 3, 2023**

Dear Neighborhood Property Owners and Residents:

Residents are invited to attend a virtual neighborhood meeting on Tuesday, May 30, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. to learn about Princeton’s 2023 Roadway Resurfacing Project. We encourage residents to attend and to send in questions / comments about this project to engineering@princetonnj.gov. Please register in advance for this webinar at <https://bit.ly/resurf23>. After registering, you will receive a confirmation email containing information about joining the webinar. On or about June 1, 2023, Princeton’s contractor, Earle Asphalt Company of Farmingdale, New Jersey, will begin repaving the following eight (8) roadways in town.

Roadway	Limits	Approximate Duration of Work*	Road Specific Details
Hutchinson Drive	Entire length	3-4 weeks	19 ADA ramps; widening existing sidepath from 6’ to 8’ where space allows
Farrand Road	US-206 to cul-de-sac	1-2 weeks	Excludes all private cul-de-sacs; Breckridge Road, Clarke Court, Scribner Court, Vreeland Court, Beatty Court, Greenland Court, Leslie Court
John Street Alley	RT-27 to Hulfish	2-3 weeks	Adding a raised crosswalk at Hulfish end
Griggs Drive	Entire length	1-2 weeks	Excludes all private parking areas; William Livingston Court, Jonathon Dayton Court, David Brearly Court, William Patterson Court
Journeys End Lane	Entire length	1 week	
Ridgeview Road	Entire length	3-4 weeks	Adding two parrallel parking spaces and sidepath near Pettit Place
Stuart Road East	Entire length	1-2 weeks	Replacing asphalt sidepath
Wittmer Court	Entire length	3-4 weeks	Storm drainage improvements

* The duration of work is an estimated total number of non-consecutive ‘working’ days (Mon-Fri), conditional upon dry weather conditions. Working hours for all roadways will be between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

Residents will observe the removal of low hanging branches by the Princeton Department of Public Works in advance of the contractor working on each roadway. Residents will also observe the contractor’s equipment being delivered and parked prior to work starting. The first phase of

work is to perform concrete related work inclusive of curb ramp replacement, sidewalk repairs, and curb replacement. The second phase of work removes the existing pavement surface from the roadway by milling; the contractor has advised that roadways will be open to all traffic during the milling phase. For everyone's safety, please use caution when driving in the work zones and be aware of construction equipment operating on the roadways. Please allow extra time for potential delays caused by construction activities.

The third phase of work is to install the new pavement surface, and it is scheduled to take place the day following the removal operation, weather permitting. **Residents will have limited vehicular access to their property.** Physical paper notices will be taped on residents' doors 24 hours in advance of installing new pavement. If you require the use of your vehicle during the workday while paving is underway, please plan to move your vehicle to an adjacent side street prior to 7:00 a.m. In the event of inclement weather (wet conditions), the contractor will postpone work until the next day with dry weather conditions. Once repaved, we request that residents stay off the new pavement until 8:00 p.m. Do not walk across or allow pets to walk on the fresh pavement during the workday, as it retains heat and may damage your shoes or injure your pet's feet. After 8:00 p.m., residents should avoid turning the wheel while their vehicle is standing still as this will mar the new pavement surface.

In order to avoid disruptions to garbage collection and recycling when work is taking place, Princeton will be notifying service providers in advance. In the event trash or recycling pickup is missed, please report missed garbage collection via SeeClickFix, and missed recycling collection to the Mercer County Improvement Authority. In case of an emergency, the contractor will accommodate all emergency vehicles into a work zone during paving. If special accommodations are required, please advise the Engineering Department at your earliest convenience.
